



Season's Record Salmon Caught By Local Reeler

Culminating 40-odd years of fishing from fresh and salt water areas, Ferd Broock, Birmingham reeler, received his biggest fishing thrill when he hauled in an extra large 44 1/2-pound Atlantic salmon. Landing this king of the fresh water fishes was quite a lengthy chore for Broock because he had to fight it for an hour and five minutes.

This catch set a two season record for a salmon caught in the Grand Cascadia area up in Quebec, Canada.

FISHING RECORDS are not new to Broock, because he still holds at the present time the Bluegill record.

Although this was his first fishing trip to this area of Canada, Broock had other good luck in addition to his large size salmon. There were two others that he hauled in, one weighing 3 1/2 pounds and the other 2 1/4 pounds.

Equipment used for the 44-pound catch was a fly rod heavier than a normal trout rod, a 10-17 pound test leader and a Dusky Miller lure.

These fighting migratory salmon which come in from the ocean are fished from a canoe that is hoisted over pools in the fast moving Grand Cascadia river. Once the fish is hooked the canoe is brought to shore where the angler fights his drawn-out battle.

Call is Out For 'League' Grid Players

Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday (August 13-14-15) will be the last time this season Birmingham area youths will have an opportunity to sign up this season in the Little Football League.

Mr. H. Lindquist, president of the Birmingham Little Football League, says coaching staff will be on hand at Vaughan and Pierce fields from 4:30 to 6:00 p.m. on these three days to explain the program to boys and their parents, and to sign up boys who want to participate.

To be eligible, youngsters must be nine to 12 years old and within the league weight range of 90-110 pounds. Birmingham Little Football League will field three units this year compared to one last season and will have both freshman and varsity teams in each unit.
