**Greenfield-Beverly
Poll Shows Voters
Want Village Govt.**

EAST BEVERLY — Greenfield-Beverly Hills Improvement Association residents, in a poll to determine what political future that area wanted, voted overwhelmingly in favor of village form of government for the northern Southfield township area, according to Ted Shurtleff, association president.

Of 555 voters in the area poll, 485 favored village government; 52 wanted annexation to Birmingham; 10 wanted to remain a part of Southfield township; 4 favored City of Southfield and one voter was undecided.

The poll, which was offered to home owners three weeks ago, is not complete, said Shurtleff. About two blocks have yet to turn in poll results.
