Missionary Work Begins At Home, Women Told

"The main thing that impressed us at the conference was that as vital as the church's overseas work is, it is the home missionary work that is so exciting today, because the church has to find ways to make Christianity relevant in this 20th century."

So says Mrs. Ina Welty, who reported recently on her attendance at a conference at Seabury House, Greenwich, Conn., on the work of the National Council of the Protestant Episcopal church.

Mrs. Welty told a Christ Church Cranbrook Women's auxiliary meeting of the September conference on the 26-acre estate, aimed at acquainting representatives of the church's leadership with the

challenges facing the church today.

"IT WAS SO that we would be able to know at the grass roots level what is being done on the national level," Mrs. Welty explained.

The Seabury conference, meeting at the denomination's national conference center, was repeated about eight times, Mrs. Welty said, with approximately 40 persons representing eight dioceses in each group. Each diocese sent at least one member of the clergy, a layman and a lay woman.

"Trying to reach people on col-

lege campuses, in the Armed Forces, and in inner-city, older church areas," Mrs. Welty said, "is the important mission of the church."

THE WORK IS difficult, conference delegates were told, in the urban, industrial civilization in which we live.

Actually Mrs. Welty pointed out missionary work starts right with yourself and in your own church. "Most exciting of all is the extension of the church in this exciting, population in the United States," Mrs. Welty said.

Keeping pace with growth and seeing that the right kind of church is built for each new community, she added, presents another great challenge to the church today.

Also attending the conference in which Mrs. Welty participated were the Right Rev. Archie H. Crowley, suffragan Bishop of the diocese, and William Banks, of Royal Oak. Mrs. Welty has been on the diocesan woman's auxiliary board, and in 1950 was president of the Woman's auxiliary of Christ Church Cranbrook.

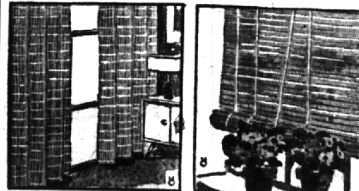

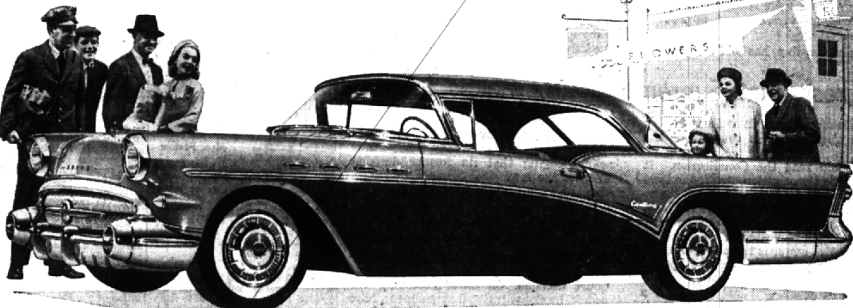
