Garden Club Presents Yule Treat

Many traditions make Birmingham the fine city that it is. One of the most famous treats is the Christmas show at the Birmingham Community House, sponsored by the local branch of National Farm and Garden.

All residents in the area are invited to see this large Christmas spectacle of beauty, and to share their holiday punch. There are many see-countless examples of holiday trimming which can be adapted to the admirer's taste.

Girl Scout troop 484, had made appropriate arrangements for the holiday season. A couple of the members selected Mrs. Burlingameham tin containers, stood them upright after they had been trimmed on the outside. Within the frame they made scenes with small ever-



green boughs as a background for small nativity figures.

BROWNIE TROOP 306 had entered arrangements made on containers. One beauty had an upright metal pie tin on a piece of styrofoam. The rim was outlined with boughs and cones, while two angels were placed appropriately in front of the arrangement.

Mrs. Robert Andrea set a handsome table with a gold thread cloth, with stemware and china with a gold accent. She used red candles in gold candlesticks, plus red matching carnations with holly to complete the motif.

As I walked through the crowded auditorium, I recognized many gardeners from a radius of a hundred miles. One acquaintance said: "I only saw one display, it was worth my trip to see the display, 'Christmas Hope.'"

THIS IS A COMPACT conical tree made on chicken wire. It is 18 inches high, trimmed with many miniature ornaments. Beside it are two peasants looking yearningly at its beauty. Many who saw it interpreted their expression as being the hope felt by so many Hungarians as they come to our shores these days seeking political asylum. It was created by Mrs. Herbert Carr.

The punch table was designed by the club president, Mrs. F. Gordon Davis. The long table had a shell pink cover with a mobile over it of pink doves, denoting the keynote of the entire show: "Christmas splendor, under the wings of the dove of peace." The two arrangements on the table were of contemporary design, executed in shades of pink, blending to orchid tones. Mrs. W. A. F. John shared her famous collection of Madonnas from all over the world, a hobby she began in 1928.

All of the beauty of the occasion was drawn toward the beautiful stage, which had a large tree trimmed in bands of turquoise ribbon placed in a horizontal line with turquoise grapes, with exotic white doves interspersed among the branches. In the background were large bare branches with hanging snowflakes which fluttered with the air currents. The stage had a covering of "snow" with a beautiful white bird feeder. To one side was a St. Francis, which added to the spiritual presentation of "Christmas splendor under the wings of the dove of peace." It was created by Mrs. William F. Ross.

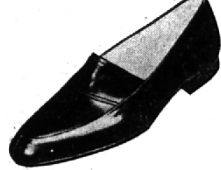

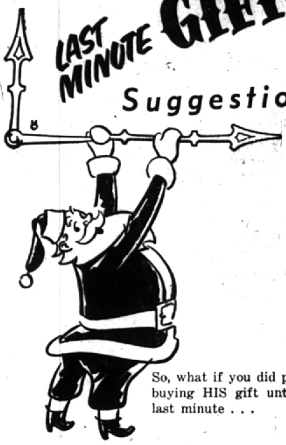
