The Lintons have lived at 208 Oakland for 21 years, coming here from Pontiac, in California. They will make their home in San Salito, near San Francisco, and Mr. Linton will be associated with his son, L. Stuart Linton in the home building business.

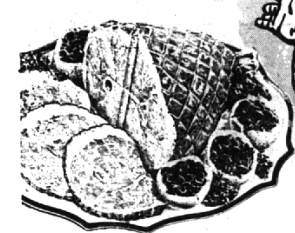

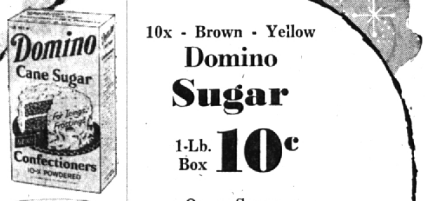
