He is also consultant to the board of the Pontiac General Hospital.

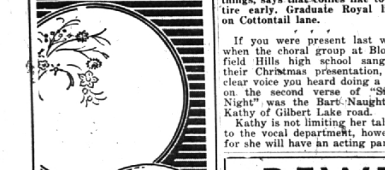
