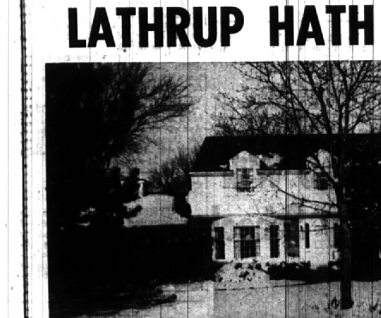

## Will Operate Cranbrook Sewage Plant

SOUTHFIELD.—Township trustees accepted a supplemental agreement with Rodney Lockwood on Lockwood's Cranbrook Village sewage treatment plant in which they agreed to take over the plant's operation and Lockwood agreed to subsidize the plant's operation until 200 families were living in the area.

The agreement is subject to approval of Township Attorney Harry N. Dell, and supplements a contract made earlier this year between the township and Lockwood.

The new contract calls for charging Cranbrook residents no less than \$4 per month towards the plant's operation. Lockwood has agreed to pay for costs to Southfield over \$4 per month per home until 200 families are living in the subdivision.

BY THAT TIME the number of families is expected to bring the cost of operation per family down to \$4 or less.

About 25 Cranbrook residents listened to negotiations Saturday between Lockwood and the board.

If the Evergreen inter-civic sewer plans are not definite by next winter, Lockwood must build temporary treatment plant which he said he would landscape.

Operation of either a temporary or permanent plant, which is designed to serve 400 families, would be charged to Cranbrook homeowners as long as the plant is in operation.

THIS IS the first such public sewage treatment plant in Southfield, and by State law, the township is required to take over the plant's operation whenever they find it operating to their satisfaction.

Lockwood and some residents present promised to form a committee to study plant operation costs and to talk with State health officials to see if a part-time engineer could supervise the plant instead of a fulltime operator which would be more costly.

Trustee Donald L. Swanson requested that an independent engineer be hired to study the plant and report to township officials.

## Flood Skating Rinks

SOUTHFIELD.—Firemen will be asked to flood public skating rinks, with cost of the operation coming out of the recreation fund, township board decided Saturday. If any private property is flooded the rink must be open to public use by Southfield residents.

ILLEGALITY of any part of the ordinance does not negate any other part of the ordinance.

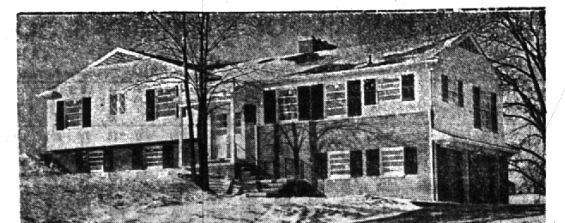
Trustee Luther Wagner led the move to have the ordinance passed so it would not be buried should Southfield residents adopt a charter Monday.
