have been laboring hard to have included in immediate northwest parking developments, got only a "will consider later if financing permits" designation. Tuesday night's action dropped Lot 2 from the list, but Lot H-11 still was not officially recognized as necessary.

In closed, City Manager D. C. Egbert emphasized the apparent need for re-studying the downtown parking problem in line with current needs, finances, and locations.

COMMISSIONERS endorsed his suggestion, told him to bring in staff studies and recommendations at the earliest possible date.

City plan board, at a hastily called special meeting Monday night, recommended that Lot H-11 get priority over Lot 2. Other commission action Tuesday night saw:

1) A \$10,000 mid-block pedestrian walkway from Maple to Hamilton dropped from consideration; 2) Necessity determined for any alley between Park and Fernside to serve northside Hamilton property, at a total estimated cost of \$15,400;

3) APPROVED necessity for a one-way crossover through the Hunter Blvd. island so northbound traffic can turn west onto Hamilton; and

4) Continued for two weeks a decision on widening of Park and Park streets until additional studies can determine the proper width of entrances onto Hamilton.

Commissioners delayed action on requests by builders in northwest Troy that the city approve to their water systems as outlined by city engineer, Harold Moe.

Commissioners want to first find out who owns the city's water system, after Claude H. Stevens, Detroit bonding attorney raised the question because the answer was needed to make bonds, to expand the system and to sell.

Owners of the subdivisions said State Health officials would not approve their water systems until some overall water plan is submitted, showing how the individual subdivisions tie in with the master plan.
