Lt. Henry Timm, juvenile officer, was advised by his physician to ob-

tain complete rest for ten days after an electrocardiogram Thursday revealed a mild coronary thrombosis.

TIMM, 58, is resting comfortably at his home at 1276 Cedar, but expects it will be several weeks before he is able to return to duty.

Patrolman Donald Moonen is undergoing examination at William Beaumont hospital to determine the cause of a fainting spell he suffered Monday at his home in Oak Park.
