Chief Moxley To Be Guest At Baldwin

Guest speaker for Baldwin PTA's meeting next Monday night will be Birmingham Police Chief, Ralph W. Moxley. A change of plans brings the chief, instead of the hobby night previously planned. By popular request, he will present two films, "Dangerous Stranger" and "Name Unknown" to the group when it meets at 8 p.m. in the Baldwin school gymnasium. Both films deal with the subject of the sex deviate.

Chief Moxley will also deliver a brief speech on this subject. This will be the third of a three point program which the safety committee launched to help counter the threat of the deviate in this community. To initiate the program, a pamphlet was distributed to all children in Birmingham schools through the police department.

NEXT, the PTA fathers' movie patrol was formed. Now, the program of education, of which the films are a part, is being carried out.

These steps have paid off, since there have been no theater incidents since the fathers have been on Saturday afternoon duty. Best of all, Chief Moxley states that, during December, there wasn't a single case of sex deviation in the police record.

Members of the Baldwin PTA group feel that viewing of the films by as many parents as can attend will help to maintain this fine record. Refreshments will follow the meeting.

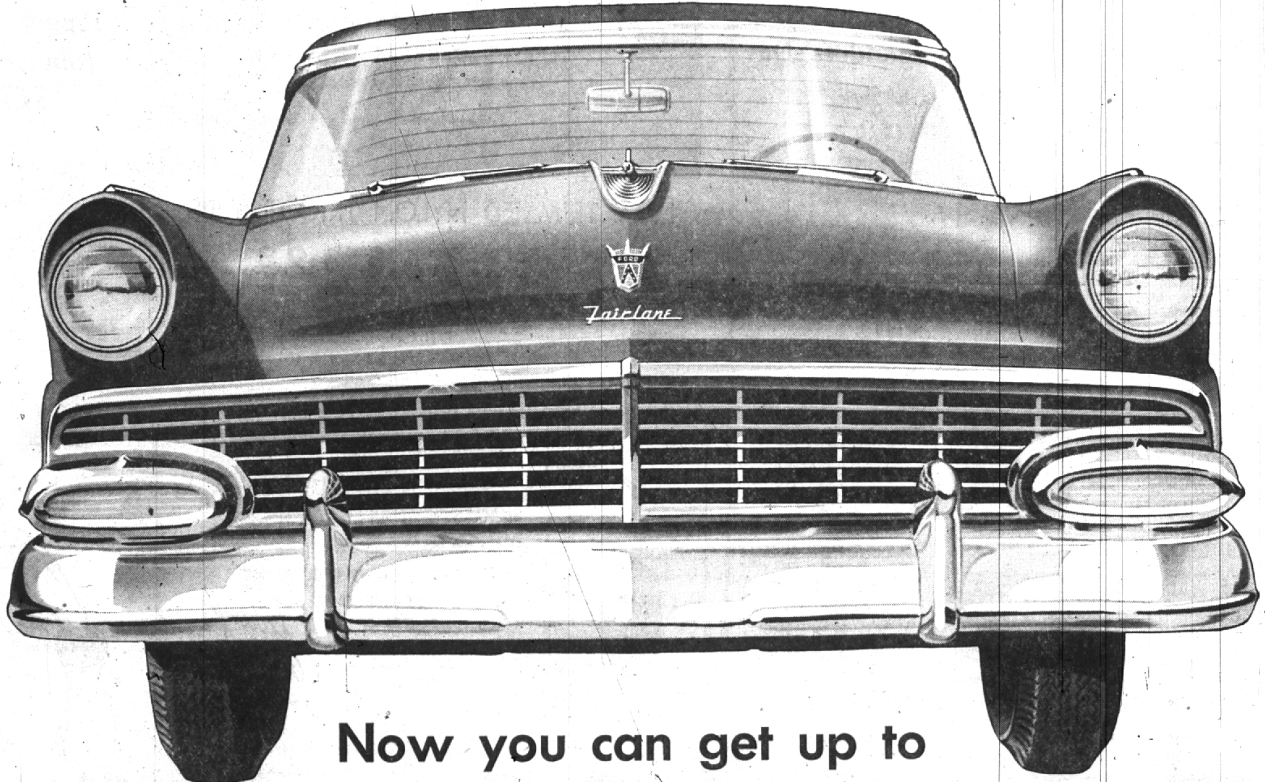
