

**Noted Churchman
To Address Meet
Of Women's Ass'n**

The Women's Association of First Presbyterian church has planned an all day meeting Feb. 22.

The meeting starts at 10 a.m., followed by a luncheon.

Speakers for the afternoon program will be the Rev. Howard D. Hannaford, D.D., Presbyterian minister from Japan, and Rev. Robert Gibson, who will introduce a series of Lenten Bible studies on the Book of Ephesians. These studies will continue through Lent every Tuesday.

DR. HANNAFORD is active executive secretary of the Interboard Committee for Christian Work in Japan. Before assuming this responsibility in New York, he had been a missionary in Japan for 38 years.

Dr. Hannaford spent more than a year in a Japanese internment camp and was repatriated in 1942. For the next few years he taught in Aleppo College in Syria, but in 1949 returned to Tokyo and resumed his teaching at Meiji Gakuin.

He also took an active part in church work and rehabilitation plans.

AS THE REPRESENTATIVE of the Presbyterian Board of Foreign Missions to the Council of Cooperation, he has helped to formulate plans for postwar reconstruction of Christian missions in Japan.

To Speak at Dinner
At 1st Presbyterian**

Dr. Ralph J. Hall, The Cowboy Missionary from Albuquerque, New Mexico, will speak at the First Presbyterian Feb. 24 Church Night Dinner.

Dr. Hall has had an unusual ministry in the Old West. His work is with the folk of the ranges, in isolated communities and homes.

AS A SUNDAY SCHOOL missionary he often works with the cowboys. He is one with them and they gather in large groups around the campfire, ready to listen to his words.

His is a ministry to Indians, Mexicans, lumberjacks, ranchers, miners, cowboys and homesteaders who have no other way of receiving the Word of God.

Dr. Hall is field representative for the unit of Sunday school missions of the Presbyterian church board of national missions.

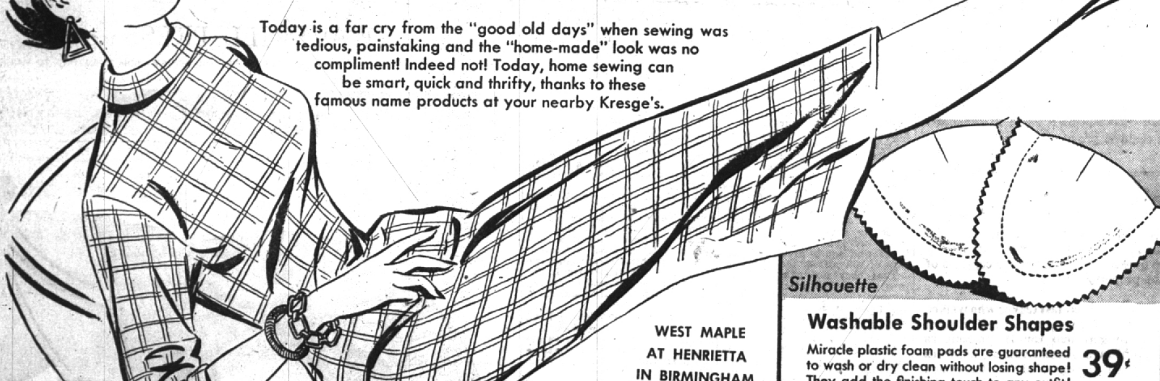
