Temporary Sewage Treatment Plant Given Approval

TROY — City commissioners Monday approved, by a 5-2 vote, a temporary sewage disposal plant to be located on Town Acres subdivision at 17 Mile and Adams.

Approval allows subdividers to erect a permanent plant if the Evergreen interceptor authority Charles Komer of E. Detroit is not in service by Jan. 31, 1957.

Mayor Frank Costello opposed the action, calling it inconsistent with the commission's earlier decision to go along with the Evergreen sewer project, which will serve western portions of Troy as well as Bloomfield Hills, Bloomfield and Southfield townships, Lathrup and Birmingham.

Komer's sub will contain 167 homes, according to Norman R. Barnard, city manager.
