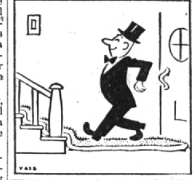
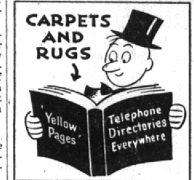
Pre-School Mothers To Meet at Torry
