Volunteer Hospital Aid Outlined by Auxiliary

Volunteer aid amounting to 12,500 hours have been donated by the Women's Auxiliary of William Beaumont Hospital during the first ten months of operations.

Under the direction of the Auxiliary President, Mrs. Lewis G. Erb, many services are being performed to make the patient's stay in the hospital more pleasant.

When a patient enters the hospital for care on Monday, they are met by Mrs. Howard Christie of Birmingham, who escorts them to the admitting desk and stays with them until they are safely encased in their hospital room. Each day a different volunteer gives this helpful service. Mrs. Roy LeMay, Mrs. H. C. Ervin, Mrs. Howard L. Linder, Mrs. L. M. Fehan and Mrs. George Schütz are workers in the admitting office.

Another service to the patient is the mobile library. A cart carrying the mail, also the latest magazines and books is a welcome diversion.

MRS. ELMER Hartwig has organized this group of 50 women. A few of the Birmingham library volunteers are Mrs. Milton Ringland, Mrs. W. T. Minewich, Miss Marian Cannon, Mrs. J. T. Southard, Mrs. M. R. Scott, Mrs. Arthur Chandler and Mrs. Phillip Sheld. On Friday, Mrs. Sheld was hostess to the entire group of library workers at luncheon at her home on 13 Mile Road.

Seventeen volunteers under the direction of Mrs. Louis J. Columbo, Jr., and Mrs. George W. Akers, assist the staff as nurse's aides. Mrs. Columbo also directs the floor secretaries, who work at the nursing stations on each floor, charting temperatures, answering phones, discharging patients and transcribing orders and records.

MRS. GEORGE T. Trumbull of Bloomfield Hills and Mrs. Edward Proctor of Wing Lake, have organized the Visitors' Information project, the newest hospital service. A volunteer is stationed at a desk on the 3rd, 4th, and 5th floors from 1 p.m. to 9 p.m., the hospital visiting hours, to issue visitor's cards. Only two guests are allowed a patient at one time. Among the volunteers in this group are Mrs. Palmer Sutton, Mrs. William Seibert, Mrs. Dale Miller, Mrs. Russell McKinney and Mrs. O. P. Dallavo.

Mrs. Roger W. Adams is chairman of the sewing group, who have made spreads for children's beds, toy bags, baby's bibs, children's pajamas, and the blue smocks used by the volunteers.

The executive office—room 258—is staffed Monday through Friday from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. by members of the board, who answer questions concerning the hospital projects.

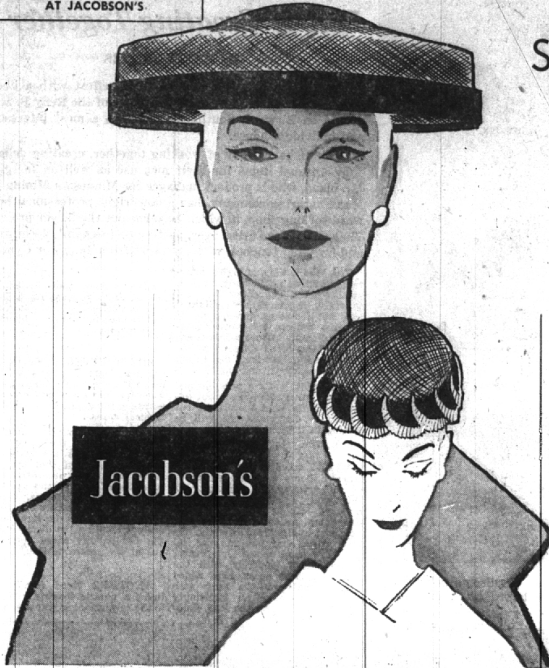
The next general meeting of the Women's Auxiliary will be election of officers to be held at the hospital, May 14th.

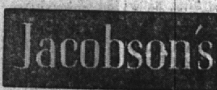
