Local CAP Constructs Quarters

After nearly six months of hard work on the part of its members, Birmingham Civil Air Patrol Squadron 633-5 has a home of its own.

The 35 by 20 foot structure stands south of a group of hangars at Berz airport on E. Maple road. Formerly Joy airport's administrative offices, the building was donated to the Birmingham squadron by Col. William P. Joy, regional CAP commander, when his airport ceased operations.

Cadets and seniors devoted their Saturdays and Sundays through fall and winter to setting up the new headquarters.

IN SEPTEMBER they spent three weeks dismantling and transferring it to its new location. Then it took night and day work in near freezing weather to lay the foundation before the ground became too hard to dig.

The industrious crew added a flat observation platform in place of the building's original roof, and painted the outside with the Air Force's colors, royal blue with yellow trim. The squadron is an auxiliary of the United States Air Force. Construction work was under the leadership of Captain William A. Teasel, 261 Strathmore, commanding officer of the squadron. The organization lists 35 senior members, over 20 years old.

THE SQUADRON'S 56 cadets are under the supervision of Captain George S. Scott, 787 Hazelwood, who is commandant of cadets.

The cadets, most of whom are students in area high schools, receive training in Thursday evening classes held in Birmingham high school. In order to complete their training, cadets must pass 11 subjects, including radio instruction, basic instruction on operation of controls, navigation, and meteorology.

The cadet training program is designed to give young aviation enthusiasts thorough background knowledge to aid them in actual flight training later.

COUPLED WITH instruction at Birmingham high school and Berz airport headquarters are orientation flights. Each student receives a minimum of six flights with Captain Scott or another experienced pilot in the squadron's two-passenger Aerona.

Studies Nature On Auto Trip

CRANBROOK — "Nature Study from an automobile" is the subtitle of a short article in the February bulletin, Cranbrook Institute of Science, written by Dr. Edgar Anderson while on a recent business holiday at Cranbrook from his job as director of the Missouri Botanical Garden in St. Louis.

While he definitely does not recommend the study of nature from a driver's seat, he does say that the front seat is a vantage point for observation, and that the only equipment required is "a little common sense and a lively curiosity as to how things are, and why they are the way they are."

"Looking at the oaks," says Dr. Anderson, "is one of the easiest and most effective avenues of understanding."

IF AN OAK tree rises straight and branchless to a feathery top, it undoubtedly once stood in a dense forest, where light reached it only from above.

An oak spread widely like a bush or a cauliflower, probably grew alone in a wide open space where light reached it from every side because trees are light-hungry, and lights direct their growth, Dr. Anderson adds.

"Every oak tree is a mute witness to forest conditions round about it," says Dr. Anderson, "not only now, but for scores if not hundreds of years."

City Issues 2 Building Permits

Birmingham building permits were issued recently to the Potter Moving and Storage and Keller-Koch Chrysler agency.

Permit of Potter Moving and Storage is for an addition to the existing building at 2253 Cole. Builder's estimate of the job is \$14,000 but the city estimates \$22,400.

Keller-Koch's permit is for remodeling the former Wigley market at 635 S. Woodward into a dealer showroom. Cost is estimated at \$16,000.
