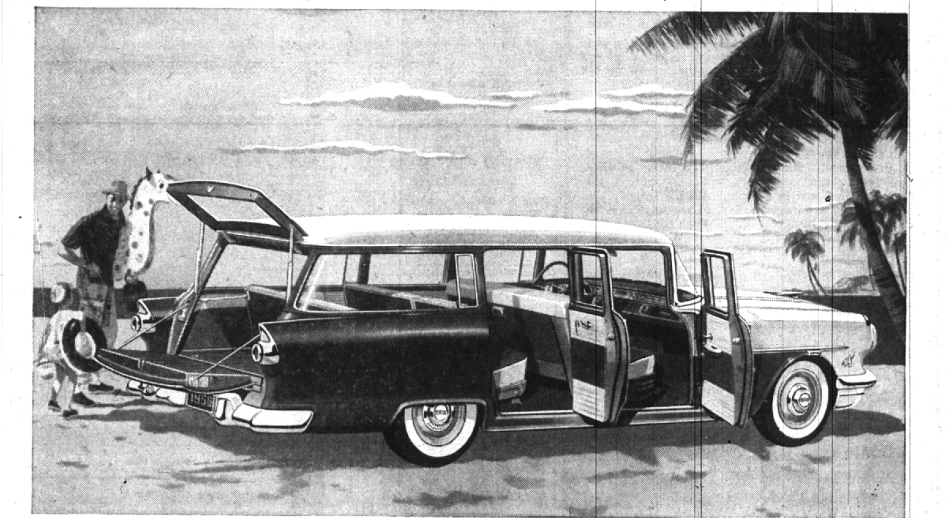
The Oakland Hills Country Club Association held a meeting Monday, Feb. 20, at the country club.
