Dye, missionary from Cairo, Egypt, will be the guest speaker. Miss Dye will explain Dr. Frank C. Laubach's method of teaching literacy by the "Each One Teach One" theory, and elaborate with phonetic picture charts.

Miss Dye has been actively engaged in literacy work in Egypt and participated in several campaigns in which entire villages have been taught to read.

Rep. Walter Judd To Join Services Of Dedication

The Honorable Walter H. Judd, M.D., has accepted an invitation from his friend, since college days, the Rev. Ralph H. Read, to speak at North Congregational church dedication services this Sunday.

The prominent Far Eastern authority, a member of the House of Representatives since 1942, will deliver the sermon at 11 a.m. services.

The new church, near LaSaver at Northwester, will be dedicated at that time to its world mission, and Representative Judd will speak on "The Church in a World of Conflict."

His knowledge of the Far East was gained through service as a medical missionary and surgeon in China from 1921 until the Sino-Japanese war, when the hospital was destroyed by Jap bombs.

Upon his return, he stamped America in a campaign to warn against the danger of sending scrap iron to Japan. His entry into politics came when voters in Minneapolis, Minn. drafted him in his candidate.
