### Report on Cost of Library to Users In and Out of City

It costs the Birmingham resident \$1.95 in taxes to support his or her public library while outside are charged a flat \$10 fee, according to J. H. Purkiss Jr., director of financing for Birmingham.

Purkiss made the cost analysis after Birmingham received a letter from Robert F. Stansberry, president of Beverly-Golfhurst Association, protesting the annual family membership fee of \$10 for use of the library.

"IN ORDER for our children to utilize the facilities of the Birmingham public library in connection with their school work we must pay an annual family membership fee of \$10. This strikes us as being pretty high. For example, non-resident children can use the Detroit public library for a mere 25 cents a year. For adults it is three dollars," said Stansberry.

### No Smoke—Just Steam

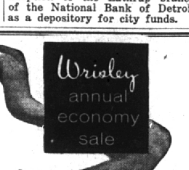
