 Never underestimate the power of a five dollar bill! The promise of one such slip of green stuff sent Birmingham high school students flocking to Highlander advertisers' establishments last Thursday, with Dave Griffith being the first to report to right advertiser.
 Dave, of 1625 Withburge, was standing in Birmingham's Eccentric offices after identifying the proper clues when Sue Savage rushed in, exclaiming, "I've got it!"
 "I'm already here," said Griffith, who said a thought wave that it must be the Birmingham Eccentric had come to him only minutes before.
 HE PLANS TO use the money on the seniors' Washington trip this spring.
 The headline "Treasure Hidden in Highlander Ad" started the "gold rush" when Highlanders were distributed shortly before dismissal time Thursday. The high school publication's story went on to reveal that the Highlander reader who first took the clue to the right advertiser would receive the reward.
