Dr. Fall will address a group of Wayne university faculty at noon tomorrow. His subject will be "The Goals and Techniques of the Liberal Arts College."

Distinguished as a scholar and administrator, Dr. Fall earned his AB and AM degrees from Oberlin college and his PhD in chemistry at Cornell university.

Besides the presidency of Hiram, which he has held since 1940, he is currently chairman of the Ohio Foundation of Independent Colleges.

Hiram college, of which James A. Garfield was once president, is unique because of its single course method of instruction.
