Mary Zakoor visited her parents, the William Zakoor, Kinross road, Birmingham, from Denver Colo., last weekend.

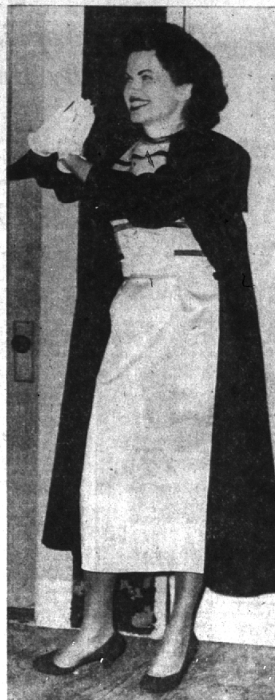
