Birmingham Men On Engineers' Week Committee

Four Birmingham area professional engineers have been named to the 11-man National Engineers' Week committee for the Detroit area.

They are Richard E. Melcher, of 1635 Terry, project engineer in charge of Parke, Davis & Co.'s recently announced \$10,000,000 research center, Thomas J. F. Papes, of 3509 Cambourne Place, partner in Campbell Engineering Co.; David F. Robertson, of 4725 Cimarron drive, design supervisor for Detroit Edison Company; and Herbert G. Stallings, of 248 Oakland, Chief Estimator for Acorn, Iron Works.

The committee was appointed by S. A. Walker Jr., president of the Detroit chapter of the 36,000-member National Association of Professional Engineers. Walker also is a Birmingham resident, having his own firm and living at 869 Yorkshire.

The group is organizing area-wide observance of Engineers' Week, Feb. 10 to 25, in conjunction with the national observance. The Detroit committee is marshaling speakers and panelists for a score of television and radio programs and is obtaining extensive cooperation in furtherance of the week. The Detroit chapter, from which the committee is drawn, has a membership of nearly 800 registered professional engineers associated with virtually every kind of industry in the Detroit area.

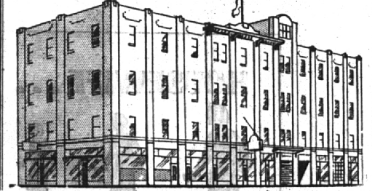
