SOUTHFIELD — Mr. and Mrs. John H. Floyd, 23128 Almiria, are still anxiously waiting news of their son, John H. Floyd, Jr., 25, listed among the missing seven men aboard a Navy plane that disappeared in the Antarctic last Friday.

Receiving a telegram Monday night from Vice Adm. J. L. Holliday, chief of Navy personnel at Washington, the Floyds learned that the Navy was making every possible effort to obtain information and they will be informed immediately when news is received.

Floyd Jr. joined the U. S. Antarctic expedition, making meteorological studies at the South Pole in November. He is a veteran of nine years Navy service as a machinist mate and volunteered for the expedition.

The missing plane was on a 400-mile flight from a trail post on Little America 3.
