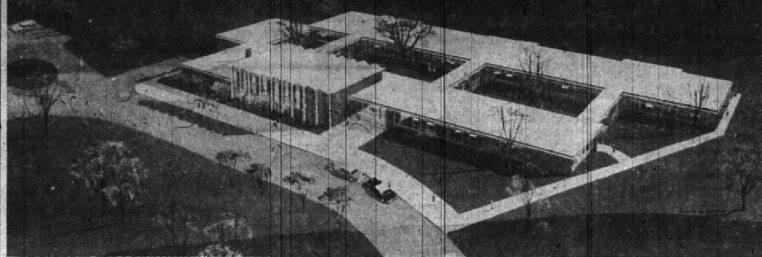

AAUW-Sponsored French Lessons Begin This Week

Yesterday approximately 25 mothers and their children between the ages of 7 and 11 began special studies in conversational French. Separate Tuesday and Wednesday afternoon classes are being held at the Community house for a ten-week period.

Classes are under the auspices of the Birmingham AAUW and are being taught by Kathryn Myers, Kingswood school French instructor.

The classes will be conducted to acquaint the children, as well as their mothers, with the French language through a study of the everyday life and customs of French children.

IN ENDORSING these classes, local AAUW president Mrs. Howard B. Green, 555 Hupp Cross road, stated that the AAUW has been encouraging this move nationally.

"We live in a world where contacts between nations are being created by science with a speed that our political forces have not been able to keep up with," said Mrs. Green.

"We know that being able to speak other peoples' languages creates a bond of understanding that is very important," Mrs. Green continued.

ASSISTANT SCHOOL Superintendent Paul Carter approved the classes, stating, "It is a distinct advantage to be bi-lingual today because of our proximity to other nations."

"Children," Carter said, "learn a second language with more adaptability than adults. Manipulation of the speech organs is far easier in young children."

The classes to help make Birmingham children bi-lingual were arranged by AAUW educational committee members Mrs. Larry Handren, Mrs. Kenneth Gibson, Mrs. Shesher Davis, Mrs. Roland King, Miss Carolyn Wright and chairman Mrs. George Mosher.

Bloomfield Hills School Board Discusses Sites

BLOOMFIELD HILLS — A special meeting of the school board Tuesday night was devoted to a discussion of future school building in the district.

The board was supplied information on the 990 building permits issued in Bloomfield township during 1955. Over half of the Bloomfield Hills school district lies in the township.

Dr. Slutz will then answer questions raised in the buzz groups during the program's last half hour. The program will end at 9:15.

For many years director of Northwood, one of the outstanding American boys' camps, Dr. Slutz is renowned for his guidance work with high school and college students. He has been a leader in the Parent Education movement.
