Photographs of the colleges will be displayed and complete information can be had on entrance requirements, courses, expenses, campus activities and scholarship opportunities.

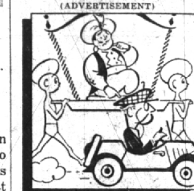
Girls, parents and faculty interested in any of these colleges are invited to attend the conference.


