SCULPTURING comes natural to the Birmingham art expert since it was part of his general art course when he studied with the New York and Paris branches of the School of Fine and Applied Art.

"His own painting is represented at the Detroit Institute of Arts and in eastern state museums, but still Dick himself has been collecting art work for 25 years."

"People can't understand why I want to acquire other people's paintings when I paint myself," says Dick, "but I can't help it."

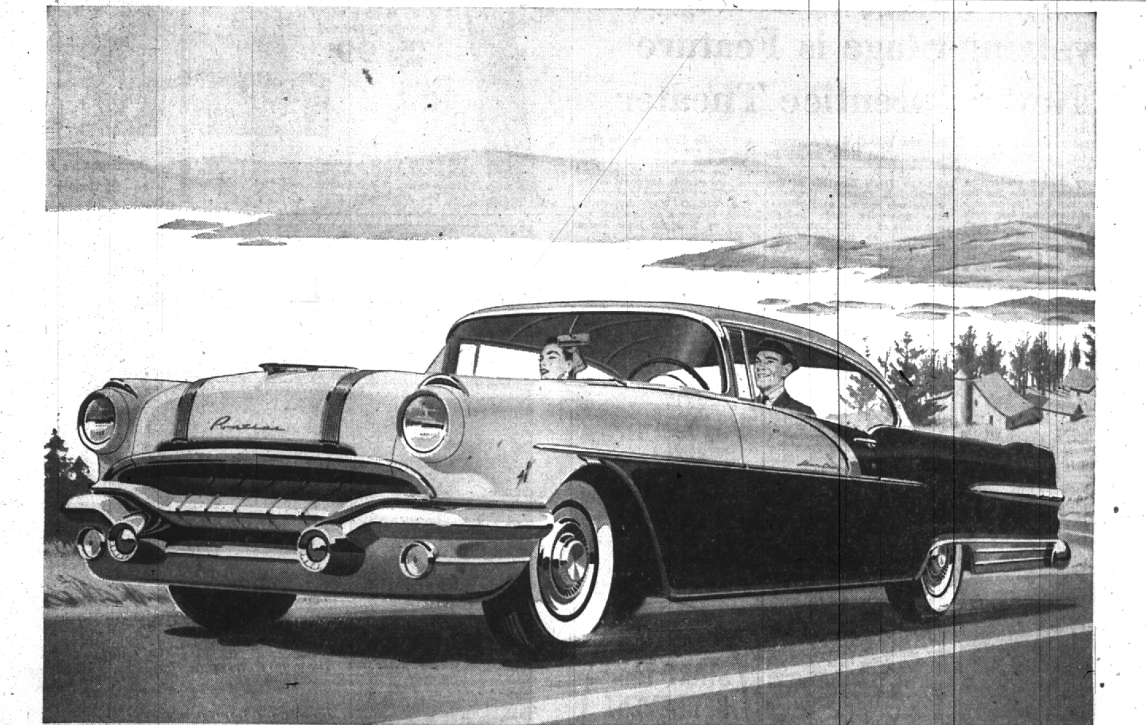

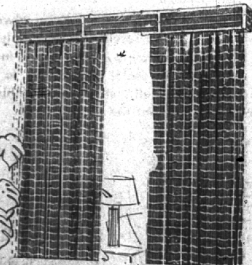
