

Reckless Driving Charges Bring Heavy Fines For 3

Three motorists were given stiff fines Friday when arraigned before Justice John C. Emery in Birmingham justice court.

Joe Jesse Freulich, 22, of Hazel Park, pleaded guilty to charges of driving under the influence of liquor. He was fined \$50 and ordered to pay \$25 costs, and ordered to turn over his driver's license to the court.

Edgar S. Green, 23, of 1577 Chapin, Birmingham, pleaded guilty to reckless driving, and was ordered to pay a fine of \$100 and \$25 costs. Green, whose license had been revoked previously, was prohibited from driving for a period of one year.

Loris S. McCray, 53, of Pontiac, was fined \$75 and \$25 costs after pleading guilty to charges of reckless driving.
