A son, William Frederick, was born June 28 to MR. AND MRS. MERRITT W. OLSEN of Townsend street, Birmingham.

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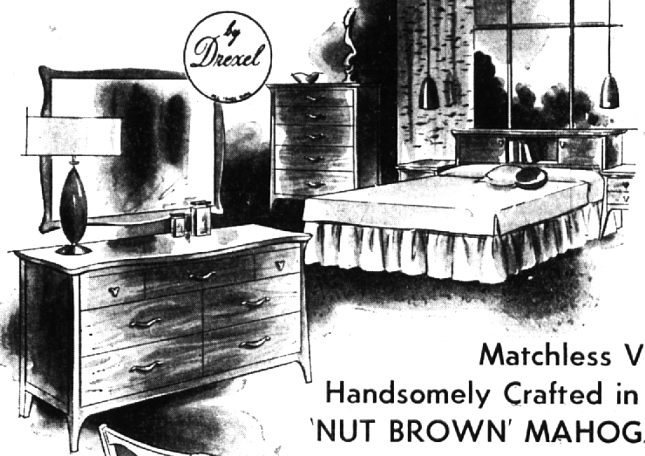
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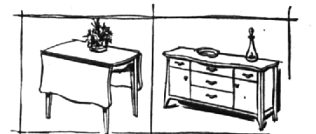
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
