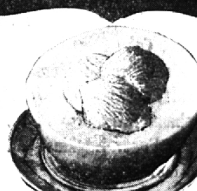

Says the Barrister

If you're like me you're pretty proud of the fact that your word is your bond.

But it is nice to know that the law is not always behind you and that some oral (not in writing) agreements may not be good in court.

When you buy your ham from the grocer for Washington's birthday or fill up the car at the corner gas station, whether on the cuff or not, the purchase is an oral contract.

However, there are some agreements which the state requires to be in writing. They are included in the law known as the statute of frauds.

ARRANGEMENTS to sell land or any interest in real estate must be in writing, even the agreement for the agent's commission.

If friend or neighbor agrees to pay for something if you don't, your friend's promise to the seller must be in writing.

Neither will the courts recognize an oral contract to sell goods or services for \$100 or more unless the buyer accepts part of them and actually receives them or makes a partial payment—gives what the law calls contract money.

So some people's word are good in law, but other contracts must be in writing.

I'll keep on in the same old way with my butcher and filling station man but believe me when it comes to a land deal, or a long term contract or a sale over \$100, I'll get it in writing because it's nice to have the law on your side.
