Recent Chevy Appointments Advance Four Local Men

Appointment of Harry F. Barr, 25620 Meadowdale Lane, Franklin, as chief engineer of the Chevrolet Motor Division and E. J. Premo, 20880 Willow Green, Franklin, as assistant chief engineer, was announced today by E. N. Cole, general manager of the company.

The appointments head a list of promotions in the Chevrolet engineering department, following the elevation of Cole from chief engineer to general manager of the division.

A native of Nevada, Mo., Barr studied mechanical engineering at the University of Missouri and at the University of Detroit where he graduated with a B.S. in mechanical engineering in 1929. Upon graduation, he joined Cadillac as a laboratory technician. He served as chief engineer of the Cadillac Tank plant in Cleveland and assistant chief engineer of the Cadillac Motor Division prior to joining Chevrolet.
