The big grey eyes of little Olli Kivimuk, 6-year-old Estonian girl, will light up when she hears she has been "adopted" by Dr. and Mrs. Harold Fairbanks, 19644 Ripley. Southfield is a field township, through the Foster Parent's plan, a means of aiding war children.

"Adoption" through this plan is financial, not legal. In "adopting" Olli, the Fairbanks have promised to contribute \$10 monthly towards the child's support, for at least a year.

Blood early, Olli will receive food, clothing, shoes and cash grant because of her physical benefits.

THE ONLY home Olli has ever known is a refugee camp. Olli's parents first met in a camp where her father was working with the camp police. The three of them now occupy one small room, barely furnished.

State Health Officer Tours S'fld; Makes Recommendations

SOUTHFIELD — State board of health inspector who surveyed recent flooded areas during a tour of the township Thursday with Supervisor Eugene Swann, made several suggestions relative to storm-caused flooding.

Swann said the inspector pointed out that opening up of the Murray drain to surface runoff on 10 Mile would not be possible because, while the Murray drain runs only a few feet through Berkeley, a smaller line ties into the drain farther south and would not handle the storm load.

"If we put water in the Murray drain, basements would be flooded all down the line," said Swann. A new proposed crossover to avoid the small drain, will allow Southfield to open the Murray drain to rain water, Swann added.

Township inspector also suggested that a county sewage pumping system, flooded during heavy rains, because it is below ground, should be raised above ground, and a new pump to be installed at 13 Mile and Waterford roads, also should be above ground.

State officials will request the county to elevate the pump, said Swann.
