West Beverly Hills association president, Chet Guilmart, requested the poll and though vacation absence of a number of the hostesses, as well as area residents, made the poll incomplete, the sampling indicated the residents are strongly in favor of thorough investigation into the home-rule form of government.  
In all 38 families were asked their preference on village government, Birmingham annexation or Southfield City affiliation.

Of this number, 47 said they were in favor of village government, 25 preferred annexation to Birmingham, though some of these felt that further investigation into the village form of government might lead them to change their opinion.  
Only one person expressed an opinion favoring Southfield City affiliation. The balance of the number approached had not formed an opinion.
