They will make their home in Bloomington, Ind., where John is in his last year of law school at Indiana university.

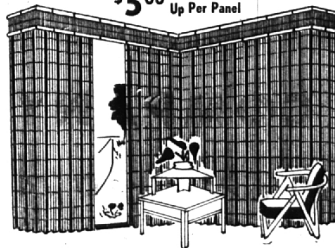
