**Polio Volunteers To Be Guests At Chapter Tea**

A countywide meeting and tea for women volunteers of The National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis has been set for tomorrow at 2 p.m. in the community room of the Pontiac Federal Savings and Loan company, 701 W. Huron, Pontiac.

Plans for distribution of polio and vaccine literature and posters will be presented at the meeting, called by the newly appointed area directors of women's activities for the Oakland county chapter of the foundation.

The new directors are Mrs. H. B. Stenback, of Pontiac, for north Oakland; Mrs. Erwin Bell, of Royal Oak, for south Oakland, and Mrs. Joseph DeVriendt, of Farmington, for southwest Oakland.

The Rev. G. Burton Holston, of Birmingham, county chapter chairman, will speak on the important role women volunteers play in educating the public about polio and the Salk vaccine.

The foundation's film on the vaccine will be shown for the first time in Oakland county.

The chapter has extended an invitation to all women interested in the March of Dimes work to attend the tea.

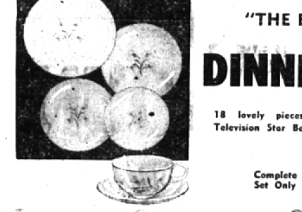
