Highway Building Increases Bond Issues for July

A report in highway financing accounts for nearly half the \$35,000,000 in public bond issues to be sold in Michigan during July, Douglas H. Campbell, vice president of First of Michigan Corporation reported today.

Two large highway issues will be offered, one of five million dollars for the Detroit-Tulsa Expressway and one of 11 million dollars for the Grand Haven-Muskegon Expressway.

School issues account for most of the remainder of the \$35,000,000 to be sold in July, which will make it the second largest bond sales month of the year. Largest of these is \$14,000,000 in Dearborn School bonds.

BIRMINGHAM and Farmington school districts will offer issues of \$2,000,000 each. July offerings will exceed June sales of \$32,000,000, Campbell said, because several of the larger issues tentatively scheduled for last month were delayed.
