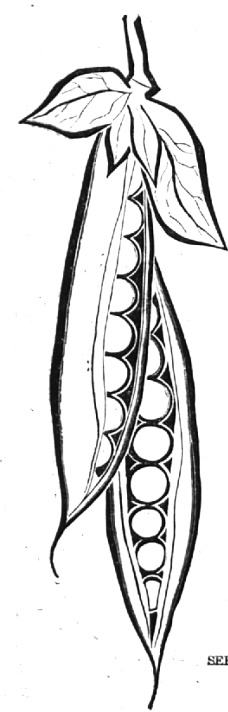

A Western-style guest ministry will include meetings around a campfire and camping out on the range for Dr. W. Glen Harris, minister of First Presbyterian church, Birmingham.

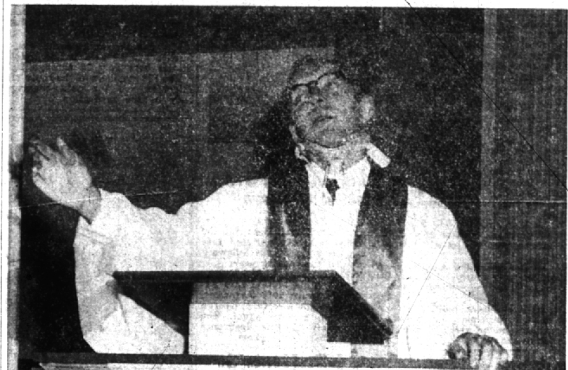

The invitation came at the time Dr. Hall, known as the cowboy minister, visited the First Presbyterian church last winter. While "home on the range" this week and next, Dr. Harris will camp out on the prairie, sleep in sleeping bags, and have his "chow" served from a chuck wagon. He will preach at night meetings around a campfire in the Presbyterian mission work.

Early successes in establishing Birmingham's first Lutheran Christian day school at Our Shepherd Lutheran church have prompted school board members to extend registrations to gain the highest possible enrollment.

School doors will open for the first time at the East Fourteen Mile road church in September, with a promised enrollment of over 60 children. School officials look for a possible enrollment of 100.

Plans call for the first six grades. The faculty will consist of Carl Christian, principal, and two women teachers.

Local Organist Attends Meet In New York

Week-long musical activities included a series of organ recitals and choral programs by outstanding New York church musicians and their choirs when L. Robert Slosser attended an organists' convention recently. The organist and choirmaster at First Presbyterian church, Slosser lives at 753 Pierce, Birmingham.

He represented the Detroit chapter of the American Guild of Organists, of which he is sub-dean, at the 49th national convention of the guild at New York's Waldorf Astoria.

He attended special services at West Point, where one of the largest organs in the world, with 14,000 pipes, is located.

THE LARGE DELEGATION of organists from all over the nation also attended organ and choir concerts at Riverside church, St. Bartholomew's, Columbia university and St. Paul's chapel, and the Cathedral of St. John the Divine.

A special midnight program at the Paramount theatre featured recording artist George Wright playing popular music on the huge Wurlitzer theatre organ.

The opening recital for the convention was played by the organist of the Paris Cathedral Notre Dame, Pierre Cochereau, at historic St. Thomas Episcopal church.
