make the volunteer police chief, Farnham, and the paid policeman directly responsible to Watchowski. Mackey expressed his belief that a daytime policeman was needed and Lathrup could not afford a full-time force and, therefore, the volunteer police chief, Farnham, and the paid policeman had not been able to get along. Mackey proposed that the city units be not responsible to each other but to Watchowski.

COUNCIL voted on this idea 2-2. With Mackey and Johnson voting "no" were Feyerisen, Campbell and Richard N. Cogger. They did not accept part of Mackey's amendment which changed the wording "police force" to "police department," and also agreed with Johnson that "city marshal" did not apply to Lathrup and accepted his wording, "police chief."

Most of the audience missed charges hurled by Hayes late in the meeting after Miss Feyerisen accused Hayes of being "one of them involved" in the controversy. "I'd like a chance to answer that," said Hayes, to which one of the parting listeners said, "staying," and returned to his chair.

"YOU ARE forcing me to bring this out in the open," said Hayes, adding that it was the responsibility of council to provide an ordinance establishing a police force and that he (Hayes) had told council shortly after incorporation that such laws were needed.

"I'm NOT prepared to say whether we could or couldn't," said Van Meer, "I would like to give way to that professional body of men, I'm certainly not in favor of rolling out of bed at all hours."

Berkshires, Home Burns, Heavy Damage Estimated
