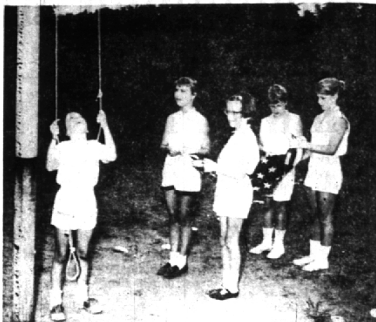

The weather in Hawaii is "perfect" according to Patty. "It's around 80 to 85 degrees during the day with no humidity and remains so at night. There is always a slight breeze which makes it perfect for sleeping."

"THE BEACH is just beautiful here," she says. "The water is clear blue green as far as you can see, but is almost like a bath as the temperature is 72. You have to watch out for the coral drifting around in some places."

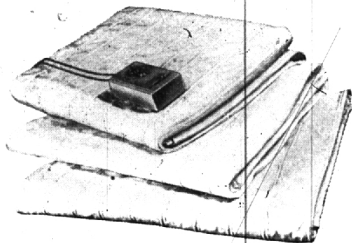
