Jehovah Witnesses
Attend Convention

The local presiding minister of Jehovah's witnesses, Floyd E. Adams, of 1712 Hanbury, is attending a major four-day convention of the denomination today through Sunday in Lansing.

With him are 30 members of the Birmingham congregation of Jehovah's witnesses attending one of 24 such conclaves throughout the United States and Canada.

Mr. Adams said "upwards of 10,000 people, mostly from the state of Michigan, will be attending the Lansing meeting in the civic auditorium."

"The purpose of the program at the convention," Mr. Adams said, "is to help supply truly the need of spiritual instruction and counsel so that every one of the preaching fellowship of Jehovah's witnesses may be able to make known to others the good news of the approaching Kingdom of God on earth."

Mr. Adams said Jehovah's witnesses take quite literally the spiritual admonition: "Do not forsake the assembling of yourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one-another, and so much more as ye see the day approaching."

Two Birmingham area church directors at Franklin Community musicians participated recently in a church music workshop at Michigan State university.

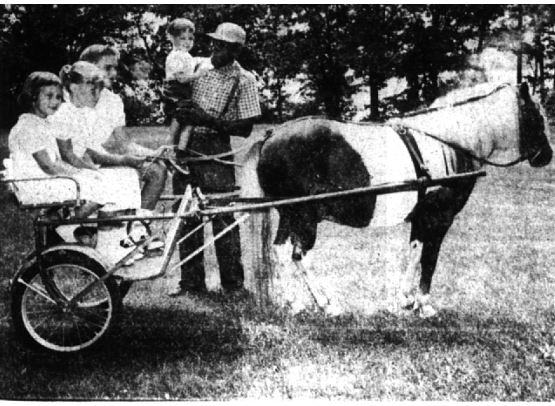

 AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 238 AND 300
 TO REPEAL ORDINANCE NO. 301
 AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL AN ORDINANCE
 NUMBER 238 OF THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM BY THE ADDITION OF A SECTION TO BE KNOWN AS SECTION 301.25, SAID SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

The City of Birmingham Ordinance: The Section and Article of Ordinance Number 238 be amended by the addition of a section to be known as Section 301.25 to read as follows: Section 301.25. Property described as: Parcel No. 115884 (E. along the west line of said section, to the point where N. 87° 58' 30" E. 142.45 (E. to the point beginning of the description of Parcel No. 87 58 30 E. 25.42 (E. to a point) Parcel No. 24 14 30 E. 571.87 (E. to a point) Parcel No. 137 30 E. 184.77 (E. to a point) Parcel No. 150 W. 368.75 (E. to a point) Parcel No. 15 W. 279 (E. to a point) Parcel No. 8 22' 22" W. 262.58 (E. to a point) Parcel No. 2 47' 10" W. 412.06 (E. to the point beginning of the description shall be reclassified from its present classification of Single Family Residence District to Terrace Residence District. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon publication after the passage thereof.
