

# Home Extension Unit Members Sample Buffet Dinner Recipes

For the last gathering of the season, members of the Graefield Home Extension unit met last week at the home of Mrs. Reilly B. Mead, 17988 Birwood, for a "tasting" party. Sampling various buffet dinner dishes, made from recipes studied at a previous extension unit lesson, members nibbled at appetizing casserole dishes, attractive salads and beautifully decorated desserts.

This year, members of the extension unit not only had the opportunity to add new recipes and ideas to their food files, but also have had equally challenging lessons in several areas of home economics—clothing, foods and nutrition, child development, home furnishings and home management. The home extension program is sponsored by the cooperative extension service of Michigan State University.

ONE SESSION during the past year was devoted to work simplification, presented by the extension service and the Michigan Heart association.

A five-step plan for work simplification was studied and unit members analyzed their household tasks which took too long, made them too tired or took too much energy and applied a new method of work. Recent developments in new fabrics and fabric finishes, indicate a need for women to know what

care is necessary to keep them looking new. Ironing polished cottons, washing and ironing dymil and glass fabrics, new starching methods were among the many techniques taught at one meeting.

THE GRAEFIELD Home Extension unit, originally composed of Graefield terrace residents, but now pretty well scattered throughout the Birmingham area, is just one of 90 home extension groups in Oakland county.
