

Artist Bostic to Present Ten-Year Retrospection

Artist Clyde Bostic, former Birmingham resident, next week will open his home on Hill street, Pontiac, for a 10-year retrospective show of his pastels, watercolors and oils.

He hopes, with this exhibit, to make the public more aware of the experimentation involved in gaining an end result.

ALSO FEATURED in the show will be subjective paintings done by his three and a half year old son, Byron.

When asked why he was showing Byron's work, Bostic said, "I feel that other parents will be encouraged to show more interest in the creative activities of their children."

At the present time, the artist is concentrating on murals and has a number of them in Pontiac churches.

For the show, which will be open to the public June 23 from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. and June 24 from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m., he plans to display his murals in natural settings, using driftwood, ming trees and other materials to gain the desired effect.

AMONG RENDERINGS he is exhibiting is one titled "The Twin," a three-dimensional oil mural he painted while living in Birmingham in 1953. Another mural depicts "Bermuda to the Phil-

ippines" and is based on his Marine Corps travels, 1947-50.

One of the more important works in the collection is "The Last Judgement" which was entered in the Kirk-in-the-Hills show last fall. . . . this show, incidentally, he feels, is the finest in the country.

FOR PUBLIC SALE at the show will be black and white prints varying in size from 24x32 inches to 48 feet. These were made from six mural type drawings; that he designed and had duplicated on club groups.

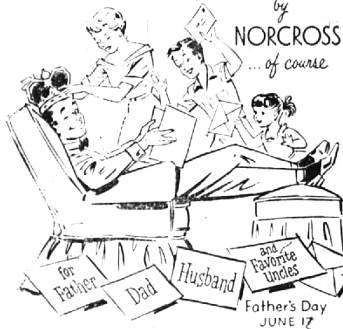

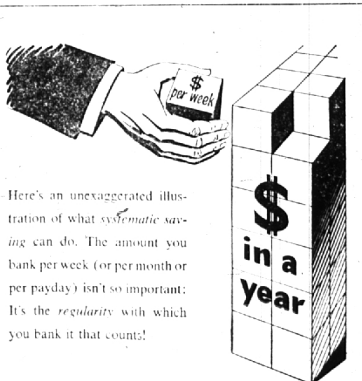
