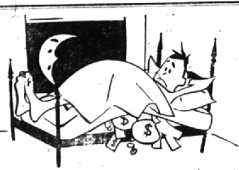

**DOWN TO EARTH English Create Garden Beauty**

LONDON: After a day of traveling over the beautiful countryside in England with the narrow lanes, high hedges on each side of the road, and the inevitable colorful intimate gardens around each solidly-built brick home, you wonder if such a feeling of garden beauty could be duplicated around our Birmingham homes.

Of course, we, too, can aim toward a goal to be known as the "garden town". Just give me any argument why we, too, can't compete with the sights I have been seeing garden-wise and I will try to counteract your points.

WE ARE TOO shy to try new kinds of plants, small and large. Children need to be brought into the garden for cutting, as well as planting, with adult assistance. Permanent shrubs and trees in their own area of the garden.

Permanent plants call them back every season for companion annual plantings to embellish the permanent plants established previously.

Yesterday I visited the churchyard of Stoke Poges where Gray's "Elegy" was written. To one side of it was a 25-acre garden of Remembrance.

Never have I seen such perfection in a garden.

WITHIN the acreage is a succession of intimate gardens designed by the famous English landscape architect, Edward White. You see areas with rock and water gardens, rose gardens, patio gardens, simple groves, waterfalls and every conceivable type of garden presentation.

There is where space can be dedicated to loved ones who have peace and rest. The area may be indicated by a plaque (usually with initials on it) with the dates, or perhaps a person might like to dedicate a space to a mother buried thousands of miles away.

Cremation urns may be sunk in the ground if you wish. A patio may have a beautiful wrought-iron gate and within the patio is a garden where an entire family may be represented within a 25 by 25-foot area. The border is not readily determined, due to the harmoniously blended flower beds and established shrubs and evergreens.

THESE GARDENS have perpetual maintenance and the funds are set up in trust for the future care.

Any little nook I could see could be duplicated with identical material in a Birmingham garden. It is the combination of plant selection which gives the goal of harmony, and we can do it.

Nobody who is a friend of mine through this column is a friend of mine if I have had a chance to make up for being gone a month over the busy planting season.

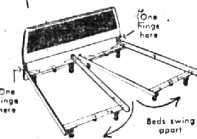
