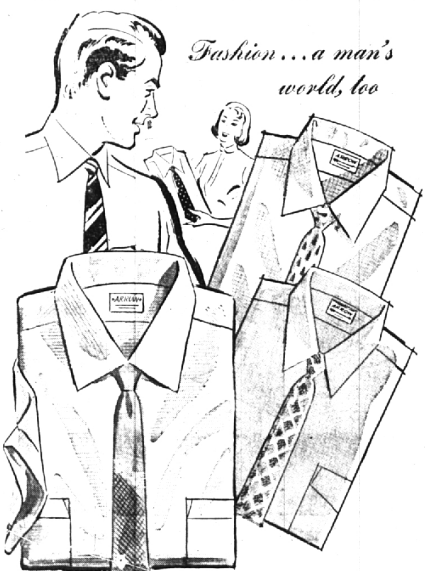

BARBARA'S WEDDING gown was floor length, styled with a fitted bodice accented by multiple tiers and embroidered organdy insert, featuring a button neckline.

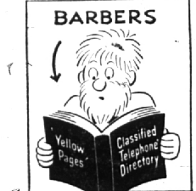
