## Transfer Jailed Mental Patient to Detroit Hospital

LATHRUP—A veteran, arrested by city police after a 110 mile per hour chase on 12 Mile road two weeks ago, has been transferred to Jefferson Memorial hospital in Detroit from Oakland county jail where he had been sentenced to 10 days in jail, according to Fred C. Ziem, Oakland county prosecutor.

Ziem began an investigation into the matter after a complaint was filed by Lathrup Justice Leonard V. Pykias, who learned the motorist was on leave from Pontiac State hospital but still had his driver's license.

THE PATIENT was committed to the hospital last November, said

Ziem, and Oakland County Probation Judge Arthur E. Galt. He filed the Secretary of State of this action by letter on Dec. 7, 1955, Ziem added.

The mental patient's driver's license now has been revoked, said Ziem. Some method now must be devised to "key" the complaints on mental patients to the secretary of state's office in Lansing so Lansing officials could take immediate action to revoke the patients' licenses, Ziem stated.

FRED S. GALLOWAY, director of Oakland County Veterans' Affairs, who wrote Justice Pykias that the patient had been transferred to a mental hospital, said: "We wish to thank you and the officers of your police department, and we trust that action taken in this case will prove a benefit to the veteran and will prevent him from a violation that would cause injury to persons, serious enough to warrant a long jail confinement."
