B'ld Hills Kids Have New Summer Recreation Set-Up

As part of their expanding services to the community, the Bloomfield Hills school system is presenting for the first time a comprehensive summer recreation program.

Directing the activities will be Don Hoff, athletic director at the high school. He will be assisted by a staff of qualified instructors and playground leaders.

Since this is the initial program for the area, the extent of activities will depend on the interest and participation by the people.

WE WILL conduct as many different types of recreation events as there is a demand for, declared Hoff.

Some of the possible events which will be scheduled are: volleyball, archery, games, handicrafts, soccer, basketball and junior Olympic contests.

The program will begin on Monday, June 25 at 9 a.m. and will continue five days a week, Monday through Friday. Activities will be conducted at the Vaughan school.

Hoff also declared that the program will not require a child to attend every day nor take part in all activities. The choice is up to the individual.

A FEE of \$10 per student will be charged for the four week session. Applications must be submitted to Mrs. Flint at the Vaughan school or Don Hoff at the Bloomfield Hills high school.
