## Schrott Student Wins \$1000 Award

Shirley Seguin, 19-year-old pianist who studies piano with Walter Schrott, director of the Birmingham Conservatory of Music, 424 Pierce, and faculty member of Marygrove college, won the \$1000 scholarship award offered by Grinnell Brothers to the most talented student in the State of Michigan. Auditions for the scholarship were held in East Lansing and the finals in Detroit. Miss Seguin played the difficult Brahms Paganini Variations which are considered one of the most difficult pieces of all piano literature.

Last month, Miss Seguin appeared with the Flint Symphony Orchestra and the Wayne University Orchestra under the direction of Vester Dooke in addition to a solo recital at the Detroit Institute of Arts.

Miss Seguin will again grace the Detroit Art Institute on Sunday evening June 17 and June 24. During these two Sunday evening appearances she will perform Liszt's Totentanz and the Chopin Concerto by Tschakowsky. Her teacher, Walter Schrott, will accompany her at the second piano.
