The wedding will take place at 3 p.m., Aug. 25 in the Trinity church in Holland.

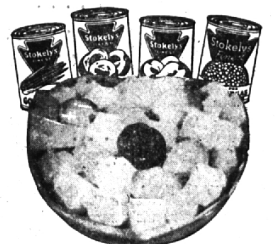
