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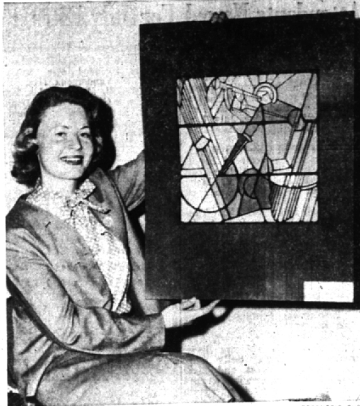
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NANCY HAY, a senior at Western Michigan college, holds her design which was used by a stained glass artist for a window installed in the school's memorial chapel.
