Forest Lake's "Mad Hatters" Show Originality in Creations

The 83 ingenious hat designers who lunched at a "Mad Hatters" party last week came up with millinery you could laugh at, admire, eat, or even soak the lawn with.
 The crazy chapeaux appeared at Forest Lake country club, where Mrs. Howard A. Schweine and Mrs. Melville T. Werner were in charge of arrangements for the event.
 Final outcome of the judges' difficult task of selecting prize winners produced six specimens of millinery, each one a story in itself.
THE LACY IRONNET worn by Mrs. Ernest Machin in the picture above (top left) was created with large pale yellow paper doilies topped with two huge yellow roses and was named as one of the "most beautiful."
 Making clockwise, Mrs. Stephen S. Bayer's hat was brimful of sewing paraphernalia, even to the boy sewing machine and miniature dressmaker's form perched on the crown. An added note of humor was two pairs of scissors, their points embedded in the crown.
 Strips of thread dangling all around the brim gave it the added note that brought the selection as one of the funniest.

IN THE MOST original category was the "Lady Laker" model worn by Mrs. Norman Terry. A miniature doll in pink represented the Forest Lake country club lady member and surrounding her were tiny figures depicting some of her activities.
 Mrs. Terry produced the four figures in the act of dancing, bowling, golfing and playing cards. The dancing figure even had a tiny box of Foot-ooz atop the hat, which formed a picture in pink and white lace.

A second prize-winner in the original category was the "Knickety Derby" scene-donned by Mrs. Ward W. Ross. Inside the fence surrounding the wide brim were racing horses ridden by pipe-cleaner jockeys, with pipe-cleaner figures looking on from the judges' stand atop the crown.
