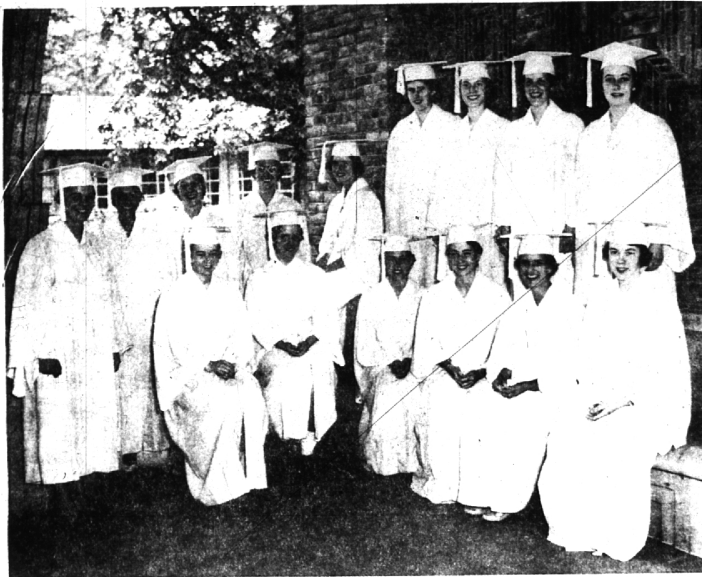

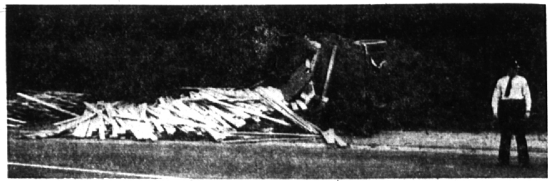


Cubs Take the Family on a Picnic
